### Classes in the morning

Basics of grammar and vocabulary taught through lectures and exercises. Training in reading and writing skills up to CEFR level A1.

### Speak up!

While the University Centre during the last years has specialized in teaching Icelandic with as little grammar as necessary, many students are specially interested in grammatical questions and comparative linguistics. This course invites during the afternoons for special training in pronunciation with a specially trained music teacher as well as for questions on grammar that set Icelandic grammar in a wider context of languages.

### Watch a film with your teacher

Your instructor briefly introduces the film in simple Icelandic and goes over key vocabulary. Films will be in Icelandic (some have English subtitles). After the film there is time for discussion.

### Picture Vocabulary

Self-study: Students will get the opportunity to access a vocabulary-training program owned by Fræðslumiðstöð Vestfjarða. They will train their vocabulary in guided self-studies. The program is based on pictures and is interactive.

### Dance and speak

Students will learn Icelandic as they dance the so-called “old dances” that are really Icelandic folk dances. The dances that will be taught are for example vikivaki, ræll (reel), skottís (schottische) and vínarkrús. Instructions are given in Icelandic and students will learn words like left and right, forwards and backwards, hands and feet and many more.

### Acting class

This course starts out with games to warm up the group and mix it together. Then students go on to some improvisations inspired by nature, first without speech and then later sounds and speech are added. This course also includes different kinds of group vocalizing and a sing-along in different languages (even Icelandic!). This course will close with some relaxing meditation.

### Grammar Questions

Here you can come and ask a teacher about grammar, whether you want to know more than what the morning lessons give you, or if you do not understand the grammar that is taught in the morning lesson.

### Reading aloud

In this course games are used to warm up and encourage group participation. The many challenges of lecturing and giving speeches are discussed and pondered over. Some exercises are performed and techniques are taught to improve speech, respiration, vocal strength and overall performance. Students will work with different texts and how to best deliver them to their peers within the group. This course will close with some relaxing meditation.

### Shoping rally

Students will be divided into small groups and sent on a mission in downtown Ísafjörður. At the first stop, they will receive a map and instructions on where to go. At each stop, the students have a task they will have to complete, e.g. find a particular person in the store and ask a question or find out how much a particular item costs. Students will also have to mark the places on the map. The answers to all the questions will be submitted to the course leader when the last task has been completed.

### Choir

You can't sing? That's no problem. This choir won't teach you singing but pronouncing. So, forget about the singing and forget about the language, simply imitate your professional choral director.

Most of the teaching, as well as the films will be at the University Centre of the Westfjords.

Some classes in the afternoon might be in other places.
