Classes in the morning: Mon-Fri, 09-12

Basics of grammar and vocabulary taught through lectures and exercises. Training in reading and writing skills up to CEFR level A1/A2. All morning classes take place at the University Centre of the Westfjords and your teacher is Jón Bjarni Atlason.

The afternoon courses: Mon-Fri, 14-18

The afternoon courses focus on the practical application of the language. Through pronunciation and conversation exercises, language games, problem-based learning, and fun lectures in easy Icelandic you will learn the language in a varied way.

Evening Courses: Mon-Fri, 20-22

How about ending the day with a movie? In Icelandic of course. We turn the classroom into a movie theater – popcorn included. Some people like to knit while watching a movie. If you don't know how to, don't worry we got you covered.

Afternoon courses

Ísafjörður City Walk

Kennari/Teacher: Dr. Peter Weiss

On your first day, the director of the University Centre will take you for a walk around town. As the capital of the Westfjords, Ísafjörður is more urban than one might think.

Talaðu! • Speak Up!

Kennari/Teacher: Bjarney Ingibjörg Guðmundsdóttir

In this course you will get a little help with the pronunciation. You will learn how to pronounce sounds that are essential to the language. Don't be shy, it's hard for everyone at first. Improvisations, sing-along and oral exercises will make this class a lot of fun.

Málfræðisurningar • Questions about Grammar

Kennari/Teacher: Dr. Peter Weiss, Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Do you have any grammar questions? Here you can come and ask a teacher about grammar, whether you want to know more than what the morning lessons give you, or if you do not understand the grammar that is taught in the morning lesson.

Fyrsta hjálp • First Aid

Kennari/Teacher: Bryndís Friðgeirsdóttir

In this course you learn basic vocabulary that has to do with first aid, body parts, injuries and other relevant vocabulary. Bryndís is an experienced teacher and runs the red cross in town. She is the best person to tell you about the importance of first aid and when it is necessary to call 112 (the Icelandic emergency number). And as a pleasant side effect you learn a lot of Icelandic.

Tölum sama • Let's talk

Kennari/Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Speaking is an effective way to learn a language, but often one is too shy. In this course your teacher will get you talking. You will practice talking with others and how to manage everyday situations.

Að blóta rétt • How to swear in Icelandic

Kennari/Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Once we get you talking, we make sure that you know how to properly swear in Icelandic. This course will help your confidence and get you talking. You will learn how to assess a situation and for instance properly describe the Icelandic weather.

Búðarall • Shopping Rally

Kennari/Teacher: Astrid Fehling

We will send you on a mission in downtown Ísafjörður. You receive a map and clear instructions on where to go and what to do. At each stop, you have a task to complete, e.g. find a particular person in the store and ask a question or find out how much a particular item costs. A good opportunity to take your Icelandic outside the classroom and practise vocabulary.

Bökum pönnukökur • How to make pancakes

Kennari/Teacher: Guðrún Sigríður Matthíasdóttir

Pancakes have a special significance in Iceland, and in particular in the West Fjords. Learn how to make a pancake in Icelandic and about the culture of pancakes in Icelandic. The course takes place in the University Centre Cafeteria

Naglasúpan • The Nail Soup

Kennari/Teacher: Jón Bjarni Atlason

Eikíkur Örn Norðdahl is a poet from Ísafjörður who like to play with the language as poets often do. Together with your teacher you will read the text and learn about the author. This course will advance your vocabulary, not least on preparing meals.

Evening Events

Íslenskar kvikmyndir • Icelandic Films

Kennari/Teacher: Jón Bjarni Atlason, Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson, Guðrún Sigríður Matthíasdóttir
Students will watch selected Icelandic films. Films will be in Icelandic (but with English subtitles). Your teacher briefly introduces the film in simple Icelandic and goes through key vocabulary. After the film there is time for Q & A. We will watch the movies at the University Centre.

Að prjóna með Sölku • Knitting with Salka

Kennari/Teacher: Salka Gústafsdóttir

Icelandic wool has been keeping Icelanders warm for centuries, and knitting is an important part of Icelandic culture and amusement. Learning to knit is a lot of fun, and it's not as difficult as you might think. Salka is going to introduce you to the joy and challenges of knitting.

IceBreaker

We start the course with an IceBreaker on Monday evening, 05.08.2019 at 20:00 at the University Centre of the Westfjords where we introduce you to the program and to each other.

IceCream

By the end of the course you deserve a proper graduation. You will receive your certificates – and perhaps an ice cream. Either way we will celebrate your successful completion of the course and say farewell.

Other events

Gísla Saga theatre and visit to the sites of the saga in Haukadal; August 20th

Haukadalur, where Gísli lived before he was outlawed, is just 60 km driving from Ísafjörður. As Gísla Saga is one of the most famous Icelandic sagas, every child in Iceland knows it and so will you after this course. You will be introduced to the famous saga in simple Icelandic, can watch the movie, and enjoy a visit to the settings of the saga in Haukadal, where you will have to put your Icelandic to use. You will watch an acclaimed stage version of Gísla Saga, performed as a one-man production.

Optional Exam August 23rd

All participants receive at the end of the course a confirmation of participation. However, if you need a graded certificate and would like to take a test you can sign up for it when the course begins. We have developed a test for level A1, A2 and B1. The test will be offered after the course concludes on Friday August 23 and costs an administration fee of 7.500 ISK.

Saturday/Sunday: Free time for own activities
