Bekkjarkennsla að morgni - Classes in the morning

Basics of grammar and vocabulary taught through lectures and exercises. Training in reading and writing skills up to CEFR level A1.
Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson.

Gúgglað til gagns - Google it

There is help out in the World Wide Web, even for a language like Icelandic. At the University Centre you are not trained to learn everything by heart but to help yourself and to be able to continue to learn and use Icelandic on your own. This course will get you acquainted with some instruments you can use on the internet, like www.ordabok.is, www.bin.arnastofnun.is or www.translate.google.com. Also, google alone can be used for finding out how to use Icelandic; at least you can see how others do. However, others might be wrong and the translation programs are still rudimentary especially when translating to smaller languages. So you need to be critical and this is the goal of this module: Making you a critical user of tools on the internet. Teacher: Dr. Peter Weiss, director of the University Centre.

Speak up! Talaðu! / Speak Up Again! Talaðu aftur!

In this course students will learn how to pronounce sounds essential to pronunciation of Icelandic. Improvisations, sing-along and oral exercises will be done to practice voice control and pronunciation. Students will work with different texts.

Málfræðisurningar - Grammar Questions

Here you can come and ask a teacher about grammar, whether you want to know more than what the morning lessons give you, or if you do not understand the grammar that is taught in the morning lesson. Teacher: Dr. Peter Weiss, director of the University Centre.

Að blóta á íslensku – How to swear in Icelandic

Knowing how to swear correctly in any given language is important – if only to be able to release anger and disappointment. Swearing's and profanities also give an insight into the mindset of the country and culture they originate from. Finally it can be useful to know these words when locals use them, possibly towards you. In this course students will learn how to swear correctly in different imagined scenarios, without going too far in that respect. Relevant videos from Youtube will be viewed, which will both teach the usage of the swear words and give insight into Icelandic culture. Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Tölum saman – Let's talk

In this course various students will engage in various daily situations and learn how to express themselves in these situations. Practical vocabulary will be the main focus although some basic grammar will also be covered. Situations that can occur in places such as the bakery, at concerts, restaurants and the library will be explored. Other daily subjects and talking points such as the weather and landscape will be covered as well as basic questions such as "where are you going?", "what are you doing?". Students will be divided into small groups where they will work together and form dialogues that can occur in different situations with a short introduction where the situation is explained. Students will then "perform" this short act to their fellow students. Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Búðarall – Shopping rally

Students will be divided into small groups and sent on a mission in downtown Ísafjörður. At the first stop, they will receive a map and instructions on where to go. At each stop, the students have a task they will have to complete, e.g. find a particular person in the store and ask a question or find out how much a particular item costs. Students will also have to mark the places on the map. The answers to all the questions will be submitted to the course leader when the last task has been completed. Teacher: Astrid Fehling

Fyrsta hjálp – First aid

In this course students will learn basic vocabulary that has to do with first aid, body parts, injuries and other relevant vocabulary. Students will learn about the importance of first aid and when it is necessary to call 112 (the Icelandic emergency number). They will also learn basic skills to respond to emergencies, accidents, illnesses, and other similar events, until specialized help arrives. Students will also get training in CPR, respiratory and how to use a defibrillator for CPR. Teacher: Bryndís Friðgeirsdóttir, B.Ed. and Red Cross Project Manager.

Kvikmyndasýningar - Watch a film

You will have the opportunity to watch two Icelandic films at the University Centre during two evenings. If students are interested we can offer more than two film screening sessions. Only two screenings will be on offer with a teacher.
