Classes in the morning: Mon-Fri, 09-12

Basics of grammar and vocabulary taught through lectures and exercises. Training in reading and writing skills up to CEFR level A1/A2. All morning classes take place at the University Centre of the Westfjords and your teacher is Jón Bjarni Atlason.

The afternoon courses: Mon-Fri, 14-18

The afternoon courses focus on the practical application of the language. Through pronunciation and conversation exercises, language games, problem-based learning, and fun lectures in easy Icelandic you will learn the language in a varied way.

Evening Courses: Mon-Fri, 20-22

How about ending the day with a movie? In Icelandic of course. We turn the classroom into a movie theater – popcorn included.

Afternoon Courses

Ísafjörður City Walk

Kennari/Teacher: Astrid Fehling

On your first day, we will take you for a walk around town. As the capital of the Westfjords, Ísafjörður is more urban than one might think.

Talaðu! • Speak Up!

Kennari/Teacher: Bjarney Ingibjörg Guðmundsdóttir

In this course you will get a little help with the pronunciation. You will learn how to pronounce sounds that are essential to the language. Don't be shy, it's hard for everyone at first. Improvisations, sing-along and oral exercises will make this class a lot of fun.

Tölum sama • Let's talk

Kennari/Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Speaking is an effective way to learn a language, but often one is too shy. In this course your teacher will get you talking. You will practice talking with others and how to manage everyday situations.

Að blóta rétt • How to swear in Icelandic

Kennari/Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Once we got you talking, we make sure that you know how to properly swear in Icelandic. This course will help your confidence and get you talking. You will learn how to assess a situation and for instance properly describe the Icelandic weather.

Búðarall • Shopping Rally

Kennari/Teacher: Astrid Fehling

We will send you on a mission in downtown Ísafjörður. You receive a map and clear instructions on where to go and what to do. At each stop, you have a task to complete, e.g. find a particular person in the store and ask a question or find out how much a particular item costs. A good opportunity to take your Icelandic outside the classroom and practise vocabulary.

Evening events

Íslenskar kvikmyndir • Icelandic Films

Kennari/Teacher: Ólafur Guðsteinn Kristjánsson

Students will watch selected Icelandic films. Films will be in Icelandic (but with English subtitles). Your teacher briefly introduces the film in simple Icelandic and goes through key vocabulary. After the film there is time for Q & A. We will watch the movies at the University Centre.

Other events

Gísla Saga theatre and visit to the sites of the saga in Haukadal; August 20th

Haukadalur, where Gísli lived before he was outlawed, is just 60 km driving from Ísafjörður. As Gísli Saga is one of the most famous Icelandic sagas, every child in Iceland knows it and so will you after this course. You will be introduced to the famous saga in simple Icelandic, can watch the movie, and enjoy a visit to the settings of the saga in Haukadal, where you will have to put your Icelandic to use. You will watch an acclaimed stage version of Gísli Saga, performed as a one-man production.
